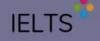




How many words should you write for your introduction?

- 2. Body Paragraph 1 90-100 words
- 3. Body Paragraph 2 90-100 words
- 4. Conclusion 25-40 words









How many sentences should you write for your introduction?

About 3 sentences

IELTS Task Achievement

BAND 5 Addresses the task only partially; the format may be inappropriate in places

BAND 6
